CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. All non-horse entries to be on Official Entry Form and pre-entries in the hands of the Secretaries by 5 p.m. on the dates specified on page 2. Horse entries online only at nominate.com.au. If you are entering online, you are agreeing to the terms & conditions and the entry is accepted as signed. No manual entries will be accepted. **NO TELEPHONE ENTRIES.** Entry fee(s) to accompany entry. All exhibits must be bona fide property of the exhibitor.
2. Cheques, Money Orders, Postal Notes are to be made payable to Clunes and District Agricultural Society Inc. **PLEASE DO NOT FORWARD CASH.** Entries will only be returned if a stamped self-addressed envelope is enclosed with entries.
3. Random swabbing may take place.
4. Entry Fees including Compulsory VASA levy must be paid at the time of lodging all entries and will not be returned.
5. Age of **HORSES will be at 1st August** and **CATTLE at day of Show**. Any infringement of these rules will disqualify the exhibit.
6. Stallions will only be permitted to compete in the classes set down for them and are to be shown with bit in mouth and must be exhibited by persons 18 years and over only, with the exception of Shetland Pony Stallions which may be ridden by a competent person to the satisfaction of the Committee.
7. No Judge shall be an exhibitor in the section(s) where he/she is judging.
8. The Judges may award a second or third prize, instead of a first or may withhold a prize altogether where the exhibit/exhibits are not considered worthy.
9. Prizes are as stated in each section.
10. No appeal against the decision of the judge will be entertained unless made within half an hour after the prizes have been awarded on the day of Show, and a deposit of \$50 made, which will be forfeited if the Protest Committee thinks it frivolous. Stewards to be made aware of all facts at the time.
11. Society reserves the right to refuse/reject any entry.
12. One or Two members of the Committee or Guests of the Society will attend each class judged as Stewards. It will be their duty to see that no obstruction is offered to the Judges and that the space allotted to them is not encroached upon, to communicate to the Secretary of the Horse Section any questions that may arise for consideration of the Committee.
13. Trophies can only be collected AFTER the Grand Parade.
14. Dogs MUST be on a SHORT lead at all times.
15. The Society will not be held responsible for any injury, loss or damage to competitors, spectators, equipment or property. Exhibits and displays shall be accepted on this condition.
16. Members' tickets can be obtained from the Secretary.
17. In the event of any section of the Show being cancelled due to adverse weather or other unforeseen circumstances, no money can be claimed by exhibitors, stallholders, etc.
18. **EXHIBITORS AND STALLHOLDERS ARE TO PAY ADMISSION.**
19. Prize money to be collected on Show Day, any money not collected on Show Day will be forfeited.
20. Novice means not having won a first prize competing in that class at any Agricultural Show or Gymkhana.
21. Intermediate means not having won a first prize competing in that class at an Australian Royal Show.
22. Proof of age must be produced on request.
23. Where applicable proof of Registration MUST be produced on request.
24. Judging will not be held up should classes clash.
25. Horses/Ponies may be measured at random or at the discretion of the Judge(s). Measuring stewards' decision is final.
26. No competitor or his/her family shall approach a Judge with regard to a decision unless he/she first obtains permission from the Ring Steward or Ring Master who may arrange an appointment with the Judge at a proper place and time. The Steward shall remain present during this meeting.
27. Judge's decision is final.
28. All foals must be haltered whilst on the Showgrounds.
29. Water will be provided in the Showgrounds for livestock and the working machinery, but exhibitors must supply their own feed and fuel.
30. The Committee reserves the right to eject from the grounds (and forfeit entrance money) any persons or persons conducting any game, table, stand or sideshow not approved by the Ground Managers. Playing or betting at any game or pretended game of chance is strictly forbidden, any person doing so will be proceeded against according to law. Permits to occupy space from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. on day of Show.
31. The Society's "Privacy Disclosure Statement" will be on display in the office on show day.
32. The Society has a Child Safe Policy and all members of the committee, volunteers, judges, stewards and those engaged by the Society for the provision of services involving interaction with children will be required to sign a Child Safe Code of Conduct.

Series Qualifier Regulations

- Open to any thoroughbred horse bred to race that has been stud book registered, either domestically with the Australian Stud Book or Internationally. Registrations will be checked by VAS office.
- Racing name to be used where appropriate. When entering if name is different to racing name, please provide the following details (if known)
 - Racing name
 - Microchip number
 - Aust ID
 - Dam and Sire
 - Date horse retired
- Riders to be 12 years and over on day of qualifying Show.
- Colts/Stallions are not permitted to contest a series qualifier.
- Qualifying Shows must be VAS Ltd Affiliated.
- Qualifying classes will be judged ridden.
- Once a horse has won a ridden qualifier, the horse cannot compete at another ridden show qualifier in that calendar year.
- All qualifying winners gain automatic entry into the Racing Victoria's Off The Track Ridden Open or Show Hunter Series State Final to be held at the VAS Ltd Saddle Horse Championships.
- To be judged as a good example of an Off the Track Thoroughbred, (rather than riding horse/hunter types), with the following being taken into consideration:
 - Thoroughbred qualities
 - Conformation
 - Manners, paces and performance
 - Injuries caused through racing such as blemishes are allowed
- Judge's decision is Final in Qualifiers and State Final.
- Show Qualifier Prizes: Sash, \$50.00 Prizemoney sent out once qualification has been verified by Racing Victoria (Prize pack collected at State Final).

228 Good Hands Challenge Trophy Qualifier

Open to girls and boys aged 10 years and under 15 years on the day of the local Show

1. The VAS Good Hands Challenge Trophy is open to boys and girls aged 10 years and under 15 years on the day of the Local Show.
2. All VAS Affiliated Shows are invited to hold the qualifying competitions. Show societies are encouraged to run one class at the Local Show which includes girls and boys.
3. The competitors shall be judged solely on their riding ability - mount, saddlery or costume will not be taken into account.
4. Special attention will be paid to hands and seat, general management and control of the horse or pony.
5. Competitors must ride using an ordinary snaffle, single jointed in the centre. The mouthpiece must be smooth and made of the same type of metal, with or without a cavesson on the noseband.
6. A gear check may take place.
7. Please note straight bar snaffle, drop nosebands, whips and spurs are not allowed.

250g plain flour	1/2 teaspoon almond essence
60g self raising flour	1/2 teaspoon vanilla essence
4 large eggs	

HERE'S WHAT TO DO

1. Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably over night.
2. Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly.
3. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.
4. Place the mixture into a prepared tin **20 cm** square, straight sided, square cornered tin, and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 1/2 - 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.
5. Note: To ensure uniformity and depending upon the size it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, Cherries into 4 - 6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces.

1. Preheat the oven to 180C (160C fan), Grease a 23cm (9 inch) round cake tin and line with baking paper.
2. Sift the dry ingredients together into a bowl. In a separate bowl, beat the eggs and oil, then add to the dry ingredients. Mix well then add the carrots, crushed pineapple and pecans. Mix to form a smooth batter and pour into the cake tin.
3. Bake for approximately 90-100 minutes.
4. Remove from the oven and allow to cool for 10 minutes in the tin on a wire rack. Upend and allow to cool on the wire rack.
